What is Asperger's Syndrome?

- * Asperger's Syndrome is a developmental disorder that affects social interaction, communication, and behavior.

- * Behavior: Repetitive behaviors, strict routines, and sensory sensitivities.
- * Strengths: Highly focused interests, excellent memory, strong logical reasoning, and very good attention to detail.
