The Baccalaureate Library





7th Grade's Urban Farming Projects






Snack Showdown: **3rd Graders Debate Cheetos vs. Takis**



Bringing Science to Life:


The Power of Hands-On Learningm

Hands-on learning in middle and high school enhances students' understanding of science beyond textbooks. Lab experiments and activities provide opportunities to apply theoretical knowledge in real-world scenarios, making learning more engaging. In biology, organ dissections, such as the heart, kidneys, and lungs, helped 7th-grade students grasp anatomy more effectively. Using microscopes to study cells and microbes also fostered curiosity and

analytical skills.

In chemistry, experiments allow students to observe chemical reactions and understand concepts like bonding, pH levels, acids, and bases. Blood typing activities introduced them to genetics and blood transfusions. Through these experiences, students develop critical thinking, problem-solving, and teamwork skills, preparing them for academic and social success.




Football Tournament Day at Our School: Excitement, Challenge, and Amazing Sports Atmosphere
