Lesson: Surah Ar-Rahman 2 (Meanings with Questions Only)

Pages: 19-25

The lesson discusses the verses of Allah, the Exalted.

Example: Explain the overall picture found in the noble verses.

The torment of Hell is described in the Surah as the torment of fierce flames.

Among the scenes of the Day of Judgment is the splitting of the sky, which appears red like paint.

The disbelievers and sinners will not be questioned about their sins on the Day of Judgment because there is a sign that indicates them.

Meaning of "Hameem": Boiling water

"Al-Thaqalain": Humans and jinn.



Lesson: The Name of Allah, Al-Wadud

Pages: 40-45

The lesson discusses understanding the name of Allah, Al-Wadud.

Example: What is the difference between Allah's love and affection, and which is broader?

The name Al-Wadud appears in the Quran twice.

Al-Wadud is a degree of love.

Allah says: "And He is the Forgiving, the Loving."

To know Allah, it helps to reflect on His creation, memorize His names, and feel His blessings.

The meaning of divine love is: His preservation for us, His support, victory, honor, and the descent of mercy and tranquility.

Ways to achieve His love include loving the Prophet, loving the believers and the righteous, loving the Quran, and getting closer to Allah through obligations like prayer.

The difference between love and affection is that love is what settles in the heart, while affection is what manifests in actions and behavior.



Lesson: The Knowledge of Allah, the Exalted

Pages: 35-39

The lesson discusses Allah's knowledge, which encompasses everything and is present everywhere.

Example: What is the difference between Allah's knowledge and human knowledge?

Angels are created from light.

Belief in angels is the second pillar of faith.

Angels are not described as male or female.

Angels are creatures of light who obey Allah's commands and do not disobey Him.

Evidence of belief in angels is the Prophet's saying (to believe in Allah and the angels...).

Duties of the angels include recording the deeds of servants, seeking forgiveness for believers, and carrying the Throne of the Most Merciful.

Humans are created from clay while angels are made of light. Humans disobey Allah, while angels do not.

The effect of believing in angels is obedience to Allah in everything and not disobeying Him because they are observing us.
