Lesson: Surah At-Tawbah (1) (Meanings with Questions Only)

From pages 8-12

The verses discuss fighting and the rulings on captives.

Example: Explain the rulings on captives.

- The noble companion who announced the disavowal of the polytheists' treaties was Ali ibn Abi Talib.
- The time granted by the Prophet to the polytheists was 4 months.
- The main motivation for Muslims to uphold treaties and agreements is the fear of Allah.
- The terms included in the declaration of disavowal from the polytheists' treaties are:
 - Disavowal from the polytheists' treaties.
 - No polytheist shall perform Hajj after this year.
 - Only a believing soul will enter Paradise.
- The disavowal from the polytheists was announced on the day of the Great Pilgrimage, which is Eid al-Adha.
- The only Surah without the Basmala (In the Name of Allah) is Surah At-Tawbah.

Lesson: Belief in Divine Decree and Predestination (1)

From pages 29-32

This lesson discusses what belief in divine decree and predestination is and the difference between them.

Example: Define divine decree and predestination.

- Predestination is Allah's knowledge of things before they happen.
- Salman the Persian suggested digging the trench to the Prophet (peace be upon him) during the Battle of the Confederates.
- Belief in predestination results in freedom of choice.
- Divine decree is Allah's judgment on things and His creation of them according to His knowledge and will. Predestination is Allah's knowledge of things before they happen.
- The proof that nothing is hidden from Allah is His statement, "Indeed, nothing is hidden from Allah."
- The Prophet's acceptance of Salman's suggestion to dig the trench is evidence of the necessity of taking means.
- Provision and death are in Allah's hands.

From pages 37-40

This lesson discusses the knowledge that Allah is the Provider, the Possessor of strength, the Firm.

Example: Mention evidence of Allah's provision.

- The impact of belief that life has a limited term is a motivation for diligence and effort.
- A Muslim's duty regarding provision is to strive and then trust in Allah.
- The evidence for the obligation to seek provision is Allah's statement: "So walk among its slopes and eat of His provision, and to Him is the resurrection."
- The impact of belief that provision is in Allah's hands: a feeling of tranquility and seeking provision through lawful, permissible means.
- The impact of belief that life and death are in Allah's hands: continuous connection with Allah, upright behavior, courage, and boldness, as a Muslim does not fear death since death is a reality and life has a predetermined limit.
- The reason for death is that life is in Allah's hands and not for any other reason.
- The reason for always seeking jihad by believers is that they refuse humiliation and disgrace but seek dignity and honor for themselves and their nation.
- A true believer is free from servitude because they genuinely believe that provision and life are in Allah's hands.
