Culture Day Project: 9th Grade

Objective: The purpose of this project is to explore and celebrate the diversity of cultures around the world. You will choose a country or culture to research, create a presentation, and share interesting facts with the class.

Project Overview:

1. Choose a Country or Culture:

- Pick a country or culture that interests you. This could be a place you're connected to, have always wanted to learn about, or just find fascinating.

2. Research:

- Learn about the following aspects of the culture/country:
 - Geography: Location, climate, and landmarks.
 - History: Important historical events and figures.
 - Language: Key phrases, greetings, or language facts.
 - Traditions: Festivals, customs, or holidays.
 - Cuisine: Popular dishes, drinks, and food customs.
 - Clothing: Traditional attire and styles.
 - Art/Music: Traditional art, music, or dance.
 - Sports: Popular sports or games played in the country.

3. Tip: Use reliable sources like books, websites (.edu, .org, .gov), documentaries, and interviews.

4. Create a Presentation:

- You will present your findings on a poster board or a (tri-fold). You may have images, music, food, etc, that has to do with the place you have chosen
- Include:
 - A brief introduction to the country or culture.
 - Visual aids (maps, pictures, flags, etc.)
 - Fun facts and key takeaways about the culture.
 - A sample of music, food, or clothing (if possible).

5. Class Presentation:



- You will present your project on Culture Day to the whole school.
- Be sure to practice so you feel confident and ready to share!
