ANALYZE CRAFT AND STRUCTURE MEMOIR AND REFLECTIVE WRITING

An *autobiography* is a type of nonfiction writing in which an author relates the important events and experiences from his or her own life. A **memoir** is a type of autobiography that focuses on a specific period in the author's life or on an experience that holds particular significance for the author. Both autobiographies and memoirs are written from the **first-person point of view**, (using the pronouns *I*, *me*, *my*, *myself*, and *mine*) because the author is relating his or her own thoughts and feelings and the events and experiences from his or her own life.

Memoirs often include **reflective writing**, in which an author provides *commentary* on the important events he or she was a part of and the important experiences in his or her life. Commentary may include an author explaining *why* certain events and experiences are significant and what he or she has learned from an experience. Reflective writing may reveal how the author feels about people in his or her life, what the author's position is on the issues of the day, how the author responds to conflict, and so on.

What readers learn about an author through reflective writing in a memoir can help reveal the author's **central ideas**, or main points.
