



IT Midterm Study Guide - Grade 6

This guide will help you prepare for your exam by outlining the key topics from "Unit 1, Lesson 1: Changes and Improvements in Technology".

1. The Troubleshooting Process

When you have a problem with technology, you can troubleshoot to solve it. It is important to know the five steps in the correct order.

- Step 1: Identify the problem.
- Step 2: Think of a possible cause of the problem.
- Step 3: Make a plan to solve the problem.
- Step 4: Test the possible cause to see if you are right.
- **Step 5**: Make sure everything works correctly.

Study Tip: Memorize the order of these five steps. For each step, try to think of a real-life example, like figuring out why a video game isn't loading.

2. Technology Careers

You should be familiar with different technology-related careers and what each professional does.

- Robotics engineer: Builds machines that can go where people cannot.
- E-commerce specialist: Uses data to see what people are buying online.
- Online security expert: Keeps computer systems safe.
- Automation expert: Makes machines and systems that work by themselves.

Study Tip: Use flashcards with the career on one side and the description on the other to test your knowledge.

3. Human-Computer Interaction (HCI)

HCI is about how people and computers work together. When designers and developers look at HCI, they are mostly thinking about the

user.

- Three important parts of HCI are:
 - The technology should be available for everyone.
 - It should have a good design.
 - It should be easy to learn.

Study Tip: Think about your favorite app or device. Why is it easy for you to use? This will help you understand the goals of HCI.

4. Technology in Our Lives

- The Invention Process: When improving an invention, like a robot-controlled toy car, driving it around to see how it works is part of the testing and making it a better step.
- Online Safety: You must be careful when you shop online because some websites are fake. You also need to be careful when looking for information online.
- Modern Tools: Technology tools like e-books allow you to carry an entire library in a single device.
- Communication: Technology has significantly changed how people communicate. You should be able to give examples of this change.
