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CONVENTIONS TYPES OF PHRASES

The Metamorphosis

Franz Kafka

A **verb** names an action or condition. A **verb phrase** includes a verb and one or more auxiliary verbs. Auxiliary verbs come before the main verb and give additional information about the action or condition, such as the verb tense, mood, and voice. In the sentence *I have walked for an hour*, the verb phrase is *have walked*. Sometimes a verb phrase is interrupted by a modifier, such as *not*, *never*, or *always*, and contractions of those words. These interrupters are not considered part of the verb phrase. For example, in the sentence *I have already walked for an hour*, the verb phrase is *have walked*, without the word *already*.

Auxiliary Verbs include forms of *be; do; have; can, could; shall, should; will, would; may,* and *must*. In some verb phrases, the auxiliary verb is part of a contraction with a noun or pronoun, as in Aisha's coming (is coming) to my house this afternoon. We've chosen (have chosen) our project for biology class.
