

Weather

- Weather includes temperature, sunshine, rain, snow, and wind.
- If it is sunny and warm, it is a good day for swimming.
- Rain is water that falls from clouds.
- Snow is frozen rain that forms flakes.

Climate

• Climate and weather are not the same.

• Climate is weather in a place over a long time.

• Temperature measures how hot or cold it is.

Seasons

• A season is a part of the year with different weather.

• The four seasons are: winter, spring, summer, and autumn. Each lasts about three months.

• Each year, the seasons repeats.



Winter

- Winter is the coldest season.
- Some trees and plants stop growing during winter.



Spring

- In spring, the days grow warmer.
- Plants begin to grow again.



Summer

- Summer is the warmest season of the year.
- Many families take a vacation in summer.



Autumn

- Autumn comes after summer. It is also called fall.
- It becomes cooler.
- The leaves on many trees slowly die and fall to the ground.


